Bassett's School-Based Health Center at Gilbertsville-Mount Upton is offering the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to students ages 12-and-older who are enrolled in the SBHC. Signed parental consent is required.

The Pfizer vaccine is the only vaccine approved for this age-group. Two doses are given 21 days apart.

Additionally, enrolled students of all ages can visit the SBHC at GMU from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Wednesdays during the summer. Students who are not enrolled with the SBHC may enroll at any time.

Other local SBHCs will be open Mondays-Thursdays this summer. A practitioner will be available for calls or telehealth visits every Friday throughout the summer.

Lead Testing Results 2020-2021

On September 6, 2016, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed legislation requiring all school districts and boards of cooperative educational services (BOCES) in New York State to test potable water systems for lead contamination and to take responsive actions. To implement this new law, the Department of Health issued emergency regulations, titled Lead Testing in School Drinking Water -10 NYCRR Subpart 67-4 (Subpart 67-4), effective September 6, 2016.

Schools are responsible for identifying the total number of outlets that require sampling. Samples must be first draw samples, collected in 250 ml containers, and taken from a cold water outlet where the water has been motionless in the pipes for a minimum of eight hours but not more than 18 hours. Samples must be analyzed by a laboratory that is certified under the Department of Health's Environmental Laboratory Approval Program (ELAP).

If lead levels are detected above 15 parts per billion (ppb) at any potable water outlet, the school must discontinue use of that outlet until a lead remediation plan is implemented to mitigate the lead level, and test results indicate that the lead levels are at or below the action level. The school must ensure that building occupants have an adequate alternate supply of potable water for drinking and cooking until the remediation plan is implemented. Schools must report the exceedance to the local health department (LHD) within one business day. Test results must also be provided in writing to all staff and parents no more than 10 business days after receiving the report.

Pursuant to the regulations, the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District sampled 90 potable water outlets that are currently or potentially used for drinking and cooking purposes including but not limited to bottle fillers and faucets. First draw samples were drawn using the EPA's 3 T's Guidelines. We have received our test results, and 6 outlets have exceeded the state-required action level of 15 parts per billion. Of the six outlets of concern, one of them could be used for cooking, so it was immediately put out of commission for cooking purposes. All other non-drinking outlets were clearly marked as water that should not be used for cooking/consumption.

PLEASE UNDERSTAND these five remaining outlets are considered non-drinking outlets. They are outlets used for things such as science experiments and bathroom sinks, etc. Although the outlets are not potable (drinking) water outlets, the district is required to notify all staff and legal guardians of students of these results. The district is in the process of working with the DCMO BOCES Health and Safety Office and the Otsego County Health Department to develop a remediation plan. Once the plan has been completed, we will resample the outlets. Once the samples are at or below the acceptable levels we will post the results to the district website. All sampling records will be retained for a period of 10 years at the district office and are available for review during normal business hours.

The following is the "Lead in Water Exceedances for First Draw Samples" test results for 2020-2021. GMU Director of Facilities Alan Digsby conducted the sampling, with analysis conducted by Microbac Laboratories.

Child Find Notice

The Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District recognizes its responsibility to provide a free and appropriate public education to eligible students with disabilities within its geographical boundaries. The District has a "child find" process that is designed to locate, identify and evaluate children with disabilities residing within its geographical boundaries, preschool through grade 12 or through age 21 if they have not received a high school diploma.

If you know a child who lives within the boundaries of the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District and attends school in the District who may be in need of special education and/or related services, please contact the District's Director of Special Education for further information regarding the referral and evaluation process. If the student is a school-age student who attends a non-public private school that is not located within the geographical boundaries of the School District, the student may need to be referred to the school district in which the non-public school is located in order to receive services during the regular school year. Please contact that school district for information regarding time deadlines for requests for services.

The District's Child Find process extends to students with physical or mental impairments that substantially limit a major life activity. Such students may be eligible for services or accommodations pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Section 504 is a Federal civil rights statute that prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities and programs receiving Federal financial assistance. Please contact your child's building principal for more information regarding Section 504 eligibility and services.


Each received a "gift box" with a certificate, T-shirt, sticker and pin in recognition of their outstanding character and exceptional sportsmanship as student-athletes.


