

2021-22 PROPOSITIONS PROPOSITION 1: GILBERTSVILLE-MOUNT UPTON CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET

Shall the following resolution be adopted to wit: RE-SOLVED, that the Board of Education be authorized to spend \$10,300,655 in the 2021-2022 school year for the education program of the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District and to levy the necessary tax.

PROPOSITION 2: MOWER PURCHASE

Shall the following resolution be adopted to wit: RE-SOLVED, that the Board of Education be authorized to purchase a new mower and to expend therefore a maximum estimated cost not to exceed fortyseven thousand and two hundred fifty dollars (\$47,250), including incidental expenses in connection therewith, and that \$47,250 Capital Reserve Fund monies shall be used to pay the cost thereof.

PROPOSITION 3: ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS
