Superintendent's Message

Looking back on another great year at GMU!

Congratulations to our Class of 2024, which graduated June 28 in the auditorium to complete their GMU journeys. On behalf of our Board of Education and the entire district staff, I commend each member of our Class of 2024 and their families on a job well done!

We are honored to have played a role in the personal and academic development of our graduates and are very proud of each of them for reaching this important milestone. Our recent graduates will continue their life journeys on dif-



ferent paths now, and we wish all of them the best of luck in their future endeavors. Before the end of the school year, we celebrated GMU's Class of 2024 with our annual Senior Walk through the hallways. Pre-Kindergarten students escorted our then-seniors once again, adding a huge dose of cuteness with their mini caps and gowns. We simply LOVE this event as it's a great way to celebrate our seniors' accomplishments while giving younger students a glimpse into their own futures.

GMU students received several awards and scholarships this past school year, and we thank the many community members and businesses that sponsor them. We appreciate our partnerships with you as we continue to work together to highlight student achievements and numerous opportunities to grow.

We also were happy to partner with Upstate Security and Ray Beach this past school year. Mr. Beach did a great job as our School Resource Officer, providing a greater sense of security on campus and building meaningful relationships with students and staff. It's safe to say he's a full-fledged Raider now!

One important thing to keep on your radar: The state is requiring all school districts to begin the process of converting from gas to electric buses by 2027 and has targeted 2035 for districts to have electric-only fleets. While we still do not own an electric bus and have concerns regarding this state initiative, we have applied for some grants. As part of one grant, New York State Energy Research and Development conducted a "bus electrification feasibility study" for districts across the state. You can see the NYSERD's study of GMU on our online Board of Education page.

As we prepare for the 2024-2025 school year – which will be here before you know it – we would like to remind you that construction is well underway at school. We can't wait to see the final product, which will include a brand new playground that will be inside of a gated, 6-foot-fence. The gate will be locked while school is in session for safety reasons, but the playground will be open for community use after hours.

A big part of the construction project is replacing our blacktop, so things are a little messy on campus right now. It's tricky to get up and down the hill – or anywhere on school grounds for that matter – so please be sure to call ahead if you need to visit. In fact, you must make an appointment by phone to meet with a specific staff member because of the ongoing construction, meetings and vacations. Our office staff work throughout the summer and are available from 7:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Monday-Thursday.

Our 2024-2025 school calendar will be printed and mailed soon, too, so keep your eyes peeled. Important dates at the start of the school year include September 3 (Open House, 5-7 p.m.) and September 5 (first day of school). Until then, have a safe and restful summer, Raiders!



Gilbertsville-Mount Upton recently received its 17th School Safety Excellence Award in recognition of the school district's efforts to keep students, staff and visitors safe.

Presented along with a check for \$500 during the Utica National Insurance Group's 42nd school safety seminar, GMU earned a Titanium with Honors level award for the 14th consecutive year.

GMU earned Platinum status in its first year in the program in 2004. After a four-year hiatus, GMU returned to the program in 2009 and received another Platinum award. A Titanium award followed in 2010, and GMU has earned Titanium with Honors every year since.

"Safety and health concerns continue to be a priority in our school districts," said Brian Saville, Senior Vice President in Utica National's Educational Institutions Unit. "Districts that go 'above and beyond' to provide a safe, healthy and focused culture for learning are to be applauded, and we're pleased to count the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District among them."

Utica National's School Safety Excellence Award Program has three levels – titanium, platinum, and gold – in which schools can earn a meritorious distinction by meeting specific criteria to enhance overall safety. Through the program, schools with their own transportation, schools with contract transportation, and BOCES are evaluated. Categories covered include bullying prevention programs, playground safety and other areas, and are measured using specific, quantifiable surveys.



If you object to your child's image, name or work appearing in these formats, you must submit that objection in writing to the district Superintendent.

FERPA Notification

This Notification of Rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is intended to advise you of your rights with respect to the school records relating to your student pursuant to the Federal "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974."

Parents of a student under 18, or a student 18 or older, have a right to inspect and review any and all official records, files, and data directly related to their children or themselves, including all material that is incorporated into each student's cumulative record folder, and intended for school use or to be available to parties outside the school or school system, and specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement (grades, standardized achievement test scores), attendance data, scores on standardized intelligence, aptitude, and psychological tests, interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher or counselor ratings and observations, and verified reports of serious or recurrent behavior patterns.

A parent of a student under age 18 or a student age 18 or older shall make a request for access to that student's school records, in writing, to the Superintendent of Schools, Guidance Counselor or Principal. Upon receipt of such request, arrangements shall be made to provide access to such records within a reasonable period of time, but in any case, not more than forty-five (45) days after the request has been received.

Parents and students are also entitled to an opportunity for a hearing to challenge the content of such records, to insure that they are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the privacy or other rights of students, and to provide an opportunity for the correction or deletion of any such inaccurate misleading, or inappropriate data contained therein. Any questions concerning the procedure to be followed in requesting such a hearing should be directed to the Superintendent.

Student records and any material contained therein that is personally identifiable are confidential and may not be released or made available to persons other than parents or students without the written consent of such parents or student. There are a number of exceptions to this rule, such as other school employees and officials, and certain state and federal officials, who have a legitimate educational need for access to such records in the course of their employment.

Students with disabilities shall have the option of deciding whether to disclose the existence of their disability on their high school transcripts.

Child Find Notice

The Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District recognizes its responsibility to provide a free and appropriate public education to eligible students with disabilities within its geographical boundaries. The District has a "child find" process that is designed to locate, identify and evaluate children with disabilities residing within its geographical boundaries, preschool through grade 12 or through age 21 if they have not received a high school diploma.

If you know a child who lives within the boundaries of the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District and attends school in the District who may be in need of special education and/or related services, please contact the District's Director of Special Education for further information regarding the referral and evaluation process. If the student is a school-age student who attends a non-public private school that is not located within the geographical boundaries of the School District, the student may need to be referred to the school district in which the non-public school is located in order to receive services during the regular school year. Please contact that school district for information regarding time deadlines for requests for services.

The District's Child Find process extends to students with physical or mental impairments that substantially limit a major life activity. Such students may be eligible for services or accommodations pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Section 504 is a Federal civil rights statute that prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities and programs receiving Federal financial assistance. Please contact your child's building principal for more information regarding Section 504 eligibility and services.
