No-Cost School Meals in 2024-2025

We are pleased to inform you that Gilbertsville-Mount Upton CSD will continue to participate in the National School Lunch, School Breakfast, and After School Snack Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2024-2025 school year.

This means that all students enrolled at GMU are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast AND lunch at no charge to your household for the 2024-2025 school year.

We strongly encourage you to fill out the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Household Income Eligibility Form, which is posted on our website at https://www.gmucsd.org/Downloads/GMU-073024-Free-and-Reduced-Lunch-Form-2024-2025-ADA.pdf. This helps the school as well as our students who might be eligible to have test fees waived or reduced fees for college courses.

MySchoolBucks

While student school meals are covered by the CEP, GMU parents/caregivers can use MySchoolBucks online to manage student accounts for extra milk, snacks and even additional meals. This easy and secure online service allows families to view student balances and deposit money into their school meal accounts any time at www.myschoolbucks.com. Any unused money in MySchoolBucks will automatically carry over to the next school year.

Bus Vote set for February 4



Please join us February 4 to vote on one proposition related to the purchase of new school buses, which will not increase the school tax levy. Bus purchases are aided by NYSED at a rate of 90%. The district anticipates purchasing two 66-passenger buses and one 35-passenger bus.

Voting will take place from noon-8 p.m. on Tuesday, February 4, 2025, at the Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Central School District. Please note that residents must present identification to vote on the following proposition:

Proposition 1: Bus Purchase

Shall the Board of Education be authorized to purchase one (1) 20-48 passenger school bus, and two (2) 48-70 passenger school buses for the purpose of providing student transportation and ancillary educational purposes, including original equipment and incidental expenses for the foregoing purpose, at a total estimated cost after taking into account state aid not to exceed \$491,000.00; and that such sum or so much thereof as the Board may deem appropriate, in its discretion, shall be paid from the Vehicle and Equipment Reserve Fund to the extent that it is funded?

Recyclin' Raiders do it again!



Congratulations to our Recyclin' Raiders and the entire GMU Community for earning another title in the Otsego County Conservation Association's Plastic Film Recycling Challenge!

Our Middle/High School students turned in 490.1 pounds of plastic film to earn first prize—an ice-cream social from Stewart's Shops—in their six-school division. This year marked the third straight regional championship for our MS/HS and fourth since 2019.

GMU's Elementary School students more than doubled that weight—with 1,174.1 pounds of plastic film—and took third out of seven in their division. Second- and 10th-graders at GMU won their respective in-school competitions.

In all, our Recyclin' Raiders combined for 1,664.2 pounds of recyclable plastic film to help OCCA set a Challenge record of 6,898.7 pounds overall. Special thanks to Ashley Hughes, Eric Voorhees and volunteers who collected and dropped off plastic film for proper recycling throughout the contest, which ran from November 2023 to April 2024.

Online Threats & School Safety

Recently, there has been an increase in social media threats impacting schools in the area. It's important to be aware that threats—whether made as jokes, pranks, or more serious actions—carry significant risks and real consequences. Sharing and reposting the threat via social media platforms only spreads misinformation and creates public alarm.



Key Points to Remember:

- **Safety First:** Our top priority is the safety of all students, staff, and our community.
- **Consequences Are Serious:** Making or sharing threats can lead to criminal charges, school suspensions, or even expulsion.
- Law enforcement and school districts immediately investigate every reported threat using all available resources.
- It's a Crime: Any threat, whether direct, implied, or shared, is taken seriously and can result in: Arrest and prosecution.
 - Permanent records affecting future opportunities.

- Disciplinary action according to the district's Code of Conduct

Report: Don't Repost

If your child sees or hears something alarming—either online or in person—please encourage them to report it to a trusted adult, school staff, or law enforcement immediately. Early reporting can help keep our schools safe.

How You Can Help

Parents, we need your support:

- Talk to your child about the seriousness of making or sharing threats.
- Monitor social media use and encourage open communication.
- Remind them that reposting or sharing threats also carries consequences.
- Do not repost, share, or promote the threat on social media. Contact school officials or law enforcement.
